RE: First Quarter Budget Adjustment

The intent of the quarterly budget adjustment process is to keep the public and City Commission informed on changes to the budget made throughout the year to address unforeseen expenditures, carry forward fund balances from projects from prior years, and to remain flexible for new projects and opportunities throughout the year.

As part of this quarterly process, a formal budget amendment may be brought forward to increase a fund's statutory expenditure authority if necessary. For this to occur, a public hearing must be held and notice of the public hearing must be given at least 10 days prior to the hearing. This is anticipated to occur towards the end of the year if needed. Throughout the year, staff will look for places to reduce expenditures to offset the impact of these items whenever possible.

Many of these items have been before the City Commission previously for consideration and this is capturing those items to formally adjust the budget to account for those decisions. A summary of adjustments is presented below by fund.

General Fund

1. KU Crossing Project – \$50,000 of unspent funds from the FY 2022 Budget that are currently in fund balance and are being requested to be appropriated to fund this project in the FY 2023 budget. 2. Master Street Tree Program – The City collects money from building permits for the construction of new homes to preserve the trees in the rights of way. These funds are held until the trees are purchased, and then they are disbursed. The fall 2022 planting did not get placed in time to occur in 2022, so these funds need to be reappropriated from the 2022 Fund Balance so that the City can purchase these trees as promised to the permit payers. Transient Guest Tax Fund

1. Lawrence Cultural Arts Commission (LCAC) – The Transient Guest Tax Fund, which funds the LCAC was hit hard during the COVID-19 pandemic. While recovery of the TGT fund has been better than expected, the pace and timing of the recovery meant that the LCAC was not able to implement their budgeted programs in 2022. The LCAC is requesting that \$48,000 of the unspent funds from 2022 be reappropriated to 2023 so that they can provide increased program funding for our artists and creative community as they continue recovering from the impact of the pandemic.
