Referenced Procedures: None

Goals for patient care:

- Appropriate and rapid triage
- Rapid treatment and transport of high priority patients
- Appropriate destination decisions as not to overload hospitals

Mass Casualty Triage Categories:

- Black: Imminent death or pulseless
- Red: Immediate and treatable life threat
- Yellow: No immediate life threat but injured
- Green: Ambulatory/ minor injuries

Patients that are normally considered code blue are considered code black in a mass casualty situation. Providers must use START triage to determine code black versus red.

Scene safety needs to be ensured.

Separate triage, treatment and transport groups need to be established and can also be broken down farther into triage categories as needed (yellow treatment and red transport).


Establish casualty collection point for ambulatory victims out of the hot zone.

Establish treatment areas outside hot zone.

Utilize START triage chart below to rapidly identify patients.

Care needs to be taken to spread patients between hospitals to minimize the possibility of overloading a single hospital.


